Normal hazards associated with any climbing activity (i.e. falls from height, impact with something solid)	All involved in the session	<ol> <li>Sessions to be run using conventional techniques as covered in the CWA, or higher awards</li> <li>Staff leading and running a session, called session leads, to have either passed Hesley Wood's in-house training and then been assessed by an approved external assessor or possess a national climbing qualification - CWA/RCI or higher qualification.</li> <li>Those with national climbing qualifications will need to show the relevant paperwork to the Duty Manager prior to the session. Copies of this will then be held by the centre</li> <li>The maximum ratio will be 1 lead instructor: 10 participants</li> <li>Session Lead may be assisted by other competent persons to maintain maximum involvement &amp; safety with their group of 10</li> <li>Helmets to be used by all participants on the wall and all spectators within the climbing compound</li> </ol>	30/11/2020
Hazards arising from the actions of 'non expert' assistants	Climbers	Staff responsible for leading these sessions to delegate responsibility appropriately to competent persons whilst still overseeing general safety	
Equipment failure	Climbers	<ol> <li>Only Hesley Wood's equipment to be used on the Tower for Hesley Wood session.</li> <li>Hesley Wood's equipment is inspected and logged in accordance with its current inspection policy including pre-session checks</li> </ol>	
Leader bolts - Climber falling with finger in bolts.	Climbers	Participants to be warned of danger during briefing     Message to be reinforced as and when necessary	
Hazards arising from the actions of group members i.e. disorderly behaviour, overcrowding causing distractions	All involved	<ol> <li>Maximum group size 10</li> <li>The Group Leader, who will know the participants, to be present during sessions</li> <li>If group member's behaviour becomes dangerous follow the Emergency Action Plan (EAP) for Disorderly behaviour</li> </ol>
